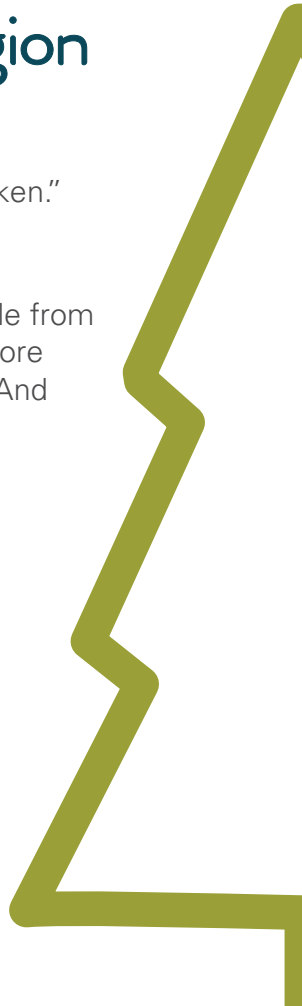

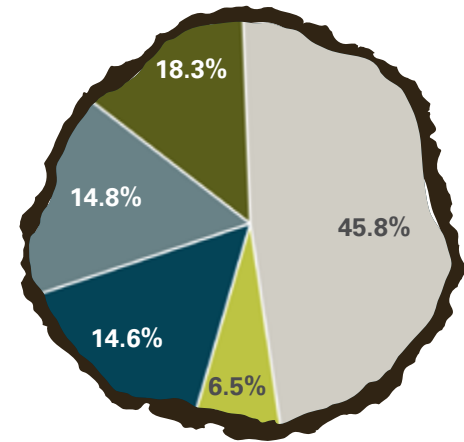

Our Impact Today

- » 26,944 participants served
- » 70 different languages served
- » 95% participant satisfaction
- » 92% of participants say that Impact NW strengthened and stabilized their lives
- » 97% felt their cultural preferences and values were respected
- » 96% of households maintained permanent housing after 6 months

A severe accident changed Michael's life. Suddenly, the life he knew was gone. He found himself in assisted living, missing the independence – and happiness – he once had.

Michael searched for years for housing of his own and a return to some of the life he used to lead.

Everything changed when he discovered Impact NW. With the help of Abbey, his Case Manager, Michael found an advocate who understood what he needed. Abbey worked with Michael to navigate a complicated world of housing.

The hard work paid off when Michael found an apartment. Finally, he once again had a space to call his own.

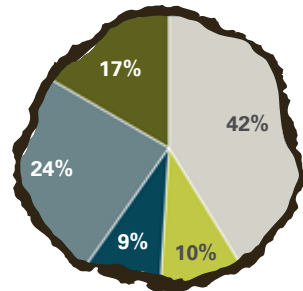
With ongoing support from Impact NW, Michael is thriving in his new home. He got a job, too, bringing him joy and financial stability.

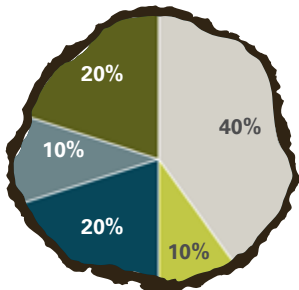
Equity and Inclusion

We envision an Impact NW where everyone belongs and feels supported in their lives, from the people we serve to our staff, volunteers, board and community.

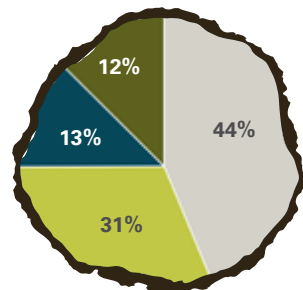
Impact NW Demographics

Melanated Participant Outcomes

Our outcomes reflect our commitment to providing anti-racist and culturally responsive services.

Melanated-Immigrant communities experience the same, strong outcomes as all of our participants.

- » **93%** of Melanated-Immigrant participants agreed that Impact NW helped connect them to new opportunities
- » **92%** of Melanated-Immigrant participants agreed that Impact NW showed respect for their cultural preferences and values
- » **97%** of Melanated-Immigrant participants were satisfied with Impact NW services overall and would recommend them to a friend



Impact NW has provided services to help people secure their housing for 58 years. But services alone won't solve the problem. We need to change systems and structures that create housing insecurity in the first place.
